

**McCloskey Accuses Nixon
Of Violating Oath of Office**

WASHINGTON June 26 (UPI)—Representative Paul N. McCloskey Jr., Republican of California, said last night that President Nixon had violated his oath of office by ordering creation of an extralegal intelligence unit directed by the White House.

He did not say that impeachment proceedings should be started, but he did propose a House inquiry as the first step toward possible impeachment proceedings.

He said that all the evidence gathered by the Senate Watergate committee and the Watergate committee and the Watergate grand jury should be made available to the House Judiciary Committee so it could begin its inquiry without spending months duplicating other investigations.

Mr. Nixon has admitted authorizing on July 15, 1970, a "decision memorandum" that called for tampering with the United States mails and burglary where necessary, supposedly to gather "priority foreign intelligence" in the interest of "internal security."
