Haldeman Is Secluded In New Calif. Residence

NEWPORT BEACH, Calif., June 26 (AP)—"How did you find us" a startled Mrs. H. R. Haldeman asked a newsman standing in front of the posh and secluded new residence of former presidential aide H. R. Haldeman.

Haldeman, who resigned his White House post at the height of the Watergate housecleaning in April, moved his family to his native Southern California recently.

The family is living on exclusive Harbor Island in a home estimated in value by neighbors at \$800,000.

"Private. No Admittance," reads the sign at the short, one-lane bridge to the quarter-mile-long Orange County island.

Mrs. Haldeman said her husband was sailing and was not available to comment on the test mony by fired presidential aide John W. Dean III before the Senate Watergate Committee in Washington.

Dean testified Monday that Haldeman and John W. Ehrlichman, the President's former domestic adviser, directed the cover-up of the 1972 break-in at Democratic national headquarters.

Haldeman's home is one of 28 expensive residences on the island. A courtyard, a five-foot high cement wall, and tall trees and shrubs insure privacy.

Indonesian Jailed

JAKARTA, Indonesia, June 26—The former chief of the Indonesian anti-smuggling forces has been jailed for aiding a car-smuggling racket. Abu Kiswo was sentenced yesterday to seven and a half years imprisonment and fined \$70,000 for car smuggling and corruption.
