

'Enemy' Namath Says It's Crazy

Joe Namath calls his inclusion among a list of White House enemies "a little crazy."

"You wonder what things are coming to when you're listed as an enemy of the White House," the New York Jet quarterback said yesterday. One of the glamor players of pro football and the only sports figure included on the Watergate list, Namath asked: "What does that mean? Who knows?"

Namath said he had an inkling about three weeks ago that something might be up.

"When I heard about them having dossiers on people, I thought to myself, 'Good, now I can find out all about myself.' I don't have anything to hide, so it would be interesting to see what they have."

Namath, here to conduct a boys' camp, described himself as apolitical. "I don't like to get involved in politics," he said. "I have my beliefs, but they're private. I've been asked often to back people or to appear for them but I won't. I won't link my name to anything I don't know anything about."
