file motions on pretrial publicity generated by the
Watergate hearings.

Mitchell and Stans are
scheduled for trial Sept. 11
on charges of conspiracy,
obstructing justice and perjury in connection with a secret \$200,000 gift to President Nixon's re-election
campaign by fugitive financier Robert Vesco. The
money later was returned.

The lawyers also were
given until July 9, instead of
July 5, to file motions asking dismissal of many of the
counts in the May 10 indictment against the two.

U.S. District Court Judge
Lee P. Gagliardi set July 16
as the dealine to submit
motions based on publicity,
but added, "I really don't
think we can reach the publicity issue until the day of
the trial."

Stans has already testified
before the televised Senate
Watergate hearings. Mitchell is expected to testify
next month.
