

'Nixon Funds Went To Wallace Foe'

Nixon fund-raiser Herbert W. Kalmbach supplied between \$200,000 and \$400,000 to the gubernatorial campaign opponent of Alabama Governor George C. Wallace in 1970, John W. Dean testified yesterday.

The opponent, then-Governor Albert Brewer, a Democrat, has said previously he was not aware he received any funds from White House sources.

Dean touched on the contribution when Senator Sam J. Ervin Jr. (Dem-N.C.) asked him if Wallace was on

the White House list of political enemies.

Dean said he didn't know, but said he did know Kalmbach had provided the money. Kalmbach formerly was Mr. Nixon's private attorney, was a fund-raiser in the 1968 and 1972 presidential campaigns, and according to recent testimony, raised hush money for Watergate break-in figures.

Wallace beat incumbent Brewer in the 1970 Democratic primary and was actively seeking the Democratic presidential nomination in 1972 until he was shot and crippled May 15, 1972.
