SFChronicle JUL 5 1973 **Nixon Wins** In Poll's '72 Vote Rerun

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Two separate measurements in the latest nationwide gallup survey give further evidence of Wafurther evidence of Wa-tergate's sharp impact on President Nixon's standing with American voters:

• In a rerun of the 1972 presidential contest, President Nixon wins over Senator George McGovern by a far smaller margin than in last fall's election. The la-test survey shows Mr. Nixon receiving the support of 53 per cent of registered voters compared with 47 per cent for McGovern. In the election, Mr. Nixon won 62 per cent of the two-party vote to 38 per cent for McGovern.

• Mr. Nixon's current popularity rating remains near his all-time low figure of 44 per cent approval. How-ever, it shoud be noted that the President's popularity rating has apparently bottomed out and remained virtually unchanged over a period of nearly two months.

The possibility exists that Mr. Nixon's popularity would have been lower than the figure reported today had it not been for the recent visit by Communist Party leader Leonid Brezhney.

In the latest survey, conducted after John Dean III's charges were made public but prior to his testimony before the Senate Investigating Committee, 45 per cent of all persons interviewed said they approved of the way Mr. Nixon is handling his job as President, while an equal number, 45 per cent. disapproved. Ten per cent, expressed no opinion.

Here is the question asked which matches Mr. Nixon against McGovern: "If the presidential elec-tion were being held today,

which candidate would you vote for - - Nixon, the Re-publican, or McGovern the Democrat?"
