Nixon Going to Kansas City for FBI Ceremony

San Clemente

President Nixon, ending a 17-day stay in California, will stop in Kansas City on his return to Washington today to witness the swearing-in of Clarence M. Kelley as new FBI director.

Mr. Nixon, who flew to his San Clemente home June 22 with Soviet leader Leonid I. Brezhnev, will speak during the ceremony at the Kansas City federal building. A 20-year veteran of the FBI, Kelley has been police chief of the Missouri city for the past 12 years.

Mr. Nixon is to return to the White House early this evening.
