At one point in "The Sovereign State of ITT," by the the British journalist Anthony Sampson, the cast of characters is oddly familiar. It includes John Mitchell, H.R. Haldeman, John Dean, Richard Kleindienst, Senator Sam Ervin and a Senate investigating committee.
