

Figure at Watergate Finally Gets Attention

STAMFORD, Conn., July 8 (AP)—With all the national attention focused on the personalities involved in the Watergate affair, the name of one principal had gone virtually unrecognized: Harry Wills.

But Alfred Baker Lewis, treasurer emeritus of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, saw to it last week that Mr. Wills received his just due.

At the N.A.A.C.P.'s 64th annual convention in Indianapolis, Lewis sponsored a lifetime membership in the organization for Mr. Wills, the \$80-a-week janitor at the Watergate complex who discovered the burglary at Democratic National Headquarters.

"The newspapers are patting themselves on the back for all they've done about Watergate," Mr. Lewis said, "but they couldn't have done it if it hadn't been for Harry Wills."
