
Nixon's Daughter Talks To British TV Viewers

LONDON, July 10 — Mrs. David Eisenhower, accompanied by her husband, carried her role as her family's main public spokesman to England tonight.

Television she answered questions from viewers ranging from why President Nixon did not lay the full Watergate before the public to how the affair affected her own social life. Mrs. Eisenhower was composed and even managed a few not altogether tight-lipped smiles as she maintained her belief in her father's innocence.

Asked whether she wished he had carried out his 1962 vow to retire from politics, she answered: "I can't wish that when I've seen my father end the war in Vietnam."
