## Did Discuss Quitting Post

DETROIT, July 11 (UPI)—Despite White House disavowals, President Nixon did raise with his family the question of resigning from the Presidency, a former Presidential aide, Charles W. Colson, asserted today in an interview with The Detroit News.

Mr. Colson said Mrs. David Eisenhower, the President's daughter, was correct in saying the subject had been raised in a family discussion.

"Knowing the President, he would use his family and he would use me often as a sounding board," Mr. Colson said. "That's typical. He would raise every question and I'm sure he raised that question."

"I also think he is enough of a believer in the country, a real patriot in the genuine sense, that if he thought it would be better to resign, he would," Mr. Colson said.
