

Watergate Witnesses-- A Long List

Washington

It will be a long summer for Watergate watchers. The Senate Watergate committee will call 20 more witnesses after today's appearance of Richard A. Moore and anticipates as many as 26 more days of hearings before completing this phase of its investigation.

A newly prepared witness list obtained by the Los Angeles Times indicates that the committee probably will not be ready to call former top White House aides John D. Ehrlichman and H.R. Haldeman before the week after next.

They will be preceded to the witness chair by President Nixon's former personal lawyer, Herbert W. Kalmbach; by former New York Policeman Anthony T. Ulasewicz, by former White House aides Frederick C. Larue and Gordon C. Strachan, and by former campaign aide Robert Mardian.

Former White House aide Charles W. Colson is tentatively scheduled to follow Ehrlichman and Haldeman. After that the committee will call former top men at the FBI, the CIA and the Justice Department, plus former White House figures linked to the burglary of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist office.

Convicted Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt and his lawyer, William O. Bittman, are among the last scheduled to be called.
