

Hidden Mikes**2 Swear LBJ
Installed Bugs****Washington**

The Nixon administration has obtained two sworn statements that President Lyndon B. Johnson installed hidden microphones and taping devices in the White House, it was learned last night.

One of two affidavits from persons employed at the White House during the Johnson administration said hidden microphones were installed in the Cabinet room in the spring of 1965.

The statement said that devices which, with the push of a button, would record telephone conversations were placed on phones in the Oval Office, at the President's suite in the Federal Office Building in Austin, Tex., at the LBJ Ranch near Johnson City, Tex., and on the desk of the President's appointments secretary at least as early as spring of 1965.

In a second sworn statement, a member of the White House Communications Agency reported that Johnson had a hidden microphone installed in 1968 in the baseboard of a small sitting room adjacent to the Oval

IN a letter Monday to the Senate Watergate committee, White House special counsel J. Fren Buzhardt said devices used to record Mr. Nixon's conversations beginning in 1971 were similar to systems used in the Johnson administration. Buzhardt gave no details.
