Washington, July 24 Secretary of State William P.
Rogers, who participated in the decision to begin the secret bombing of Cambodia in March of 1969, repeatedly assured the Senate Foreign Relations committee more than a year later that the United States was doing nothing to violate Cambodian neutrality, excerpts from his classified testimony showed today.

Asked generally at the time about the American role in Cambodia, Mr. Rogers declared, according to the transcript: "Cambodia is one country where we can say with complete assurance that our hands are clean and our hearts are pure."
