Marvin Kalb, a CBS newsman who covers the State Department, says his office has been illegally entered and, on at least one occasion, ransacked.

Kalb, on the list of White House "enemies," said he entered his office on July 9 to find it "in shambles with papers strewn around and broadcast instruments on the floor."

Kalb's home telephone and perhaps his phone in his State Department office were bugged in 1969-70 as part of the Nixon administration's attempt to plug leaks to newsmen, according to government sources.

His name was also on the list of White House enemies presented to the Senate Watergate committee by former presidential counsel John W. Dean III.

Last Monday, <sup>July</sup> Kalb said, he again found evidence that his office had been entered. However, department officials said janitors may have left the office in disarray.

Secretary of State William P. Rogers called Kalb to apologize and express concern over the two incidents.

State Department officials said no evidence has been turned up concerning the incident. The newsman said nothing appeared to be missing.
