The chairman of a congressional investigations subcommittee said yesterday he plans to subpoena records of government spending to improve President Nixon's homes in Florida and California.

Brooks accused the administration of making a "systematic effort" to impede an investigation by "arrogant contempt" for Congress in refusing to turn over documents on expenditures on the President's properties in Key Biscayne, Fla., and San Clemente, Calif.
