U.S. Agrees To Split

by a Wishington Post Starf Writer NEW YORK, July 31—The papers filed here yesterday, to separate the trial of Harry L. Sears from that of former Cabinet members John N. Mitchell and Maurice Stans.

The three, along with further financier Robert L. Vesco, were indicted here vay 10 for obstruction of justice and conspirary in connection with a \$200,000 payment of Vesco to the Nixon re-election campaign.

Mitchell and Stans also were charged with perjury before the grand jury.

The government said it agreed to severing Sears' trial from the others because 'Sears' has made certain statements which would not be admissible at a joint trial."

It asked that Sears trial begin shortly after the first trial has ended. The trial of Mitchell and Stans is hed-uled to begin Sept. 11.

The covernment also opposed motions by Seas and Stars to dismiss the indictments change the venue and continue the cases indefinitely because of pretrial problemy.

Whatever publicity did dome about, said the government, made no comment as to the guilt of hose charged.
