**Wire Critical of Nixon
Runs Into an Objection**

The news that Representative Robert F. Drinan had introduced a resolution to impeach President Nixon delighted Mr. and Mrs. William Morris of Old Greenwich, Conn.

It apparently did not delight a certain Western Union operator—a fact Mr. Morris discovered when he tried to wire the couple's congratulations to Representative Drinan.

The message, "Congratulations on Your Move to Impeach Self-Appointed King Richard the Last," was evidently too much for the unidentified operator.

"She told me 'I will not take this; you'll have to get someone else,' and then slammed down the phone," reported Mr. Morris, who said he was "absolutely appalled."

Arthur L. Murphy, a supervisor at Western Union's East Coast message center in Moorestown, N. J., said: "It absolutely should not have happened." He apologized to Mr. and Mrs. Morris and assured them their second attempt to send the telegram had been successful.
