**8 Ousted From Room  
For Disrupting Inquiry**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7— Eight persons were arrested today and charged with disrupting the Senate Watergate hearings after they began reading a statement accusing the Central Intelligence Agency of "intervening in domestic political life."

They were removed from the hearing room on the orders of the committee chairman, Senator Sam J. Ervin Jr. Seven are residents of New York City. They are Elijah Cunningham Boyd Jr., 252 West 108th Street; Michel R. Colen, 220 West 98th Street; Paul Neil Goldstein, 615 West 184th Street; Ian D. Levit, 57 West 75th Street; Melanie Doris Saunders, 614 West 138th Street; Sus J. Wagner, 300 West 109th Street, and David Myron Wasserman, 219 West 15th Street.

Only Mr. Levit, a cab driver, told the Capitol police of his occupation.

The eight were charged with unlawful entry and disrupting Congress and were released on bail.
