McGovern Donor List, Outlay in Conn. Probed

HARTFORD, Conn., Aug. 7—The Federal Bureau of Investigation is inspecting the list of contributions and expenditures reported in 1972 by the Connecticut Committee to Elect Sen. George S. McGovern of South Dakota as President, it was learned today.

South Dakota as rrestuent, it was learned today. An FBI agent spent his second day today studying the McGovern committee's Connecticut financial report for the 1972 at the office of the Secretary of the State, Gloria Schaffer.

Mrs. Schaffer said the FBI agent told her the inspection is being made in behalf of Archibald Cox, special prosecutor in the Watergate investigation. "He telephoned me and asked permission to look at the 1972 records," Mrs. Schaffer said. "I told him the records are open to the public and we would make copies of anything he wanted."

wanted." Herbert D. Clough Jr., assistant special agent in charge of the FBI in New Haven said, "We are making a preliminary and limited inquiry on specific instructions from Cox."

(Clough said the investigation was connected with an allegation from a party "not connected with Watergate." He said the investigation will probably include interviews with people in and out of Connecticut.)
