BOSTON, Aug. 8—The Mas-sachusetts Bar Association an-nounced that it has been informally investigating Charles Colson, former special counsel to President Nixon, and Ger-ald Alch, former lawyer for convicted Watergate burglar James CmCord.

Richard J. Vita, the bar as-sociation's chief investigator, said the inquiry has been go-ing on for four months on Colson and two months on Alch regarding their roles in the

ments." Colson is registered with the Massachusetts Bar, but does not practice in this state. He is a partner in the firm of Colson and Shapiro in Wash-ington. Alch is associated with the Boston law firm of F. Lee Bailey Bailey.

According to Vita, the bar association will not start any formal action until the find-ings of the Senate Watergate committee and Special Prose-cutor Archibald Cox are made public public.
