

Woman Spy

To Get the

'Dirty Stuff'

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — The Washington Star-News quoted a woman journalist today as having admitted working as a \$1000-a-week spy for President Nixon's re-election campaign, posing as a reporter and traveling with the press entourage that accompanied Sen. George McGovern.

The Star-News said the woman, identified as Mrs. Lucianne Goldberg, 38, said she had been recruited by Murray Chotiner, long-time Nixon friend and political adviser and paid through Chotiner's Washington law firm.

The information sought, Mrs. Goldberg was quoted

as telling the newspaper, was not political intelligence but the "really dirty stuff— who was sleeping with who, what the Secret Service men were doing with the stewardesses, who was smoking pot on the plane — that sort of thing. I was told to send it all along."

Other undercover operatives were assigned to the campaign tours of Sargent Shriver and Spiro Agnew. Mrs. Goldberg was quoted as saying.
