

# Seen in Plot On Nixon

The Secret Service said yesterday it was continuing an investigation of a possible plot to assassinate President Nixon but declined to furnish any details.

A spokesman said the investigation may have taken some time in New Orleans where the President was to have arrived Monday on his route because of a threat to his life.

While making no inquiry for the Secret Service, Sturgis said the date of the assassination had been cancelled because the route was not being taken on its part.
