**NADER WANTS NIXON
AND AGNEW TO LEAVE**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2 (UPI) — Ralph Nader said today that President Nixon and Vice President Agnew should leave office, contending that "the country would really be well served if these two officials would resign."

Mr. Nader said Mr. Nixon, in his handling of the Watergate scandal, and Mr. Agnew, in unspecified ways, had failed to "manage a great deal of trust in government."

The public interest lawyer and consumer advocate said he thought Mr. Nixon had consciously tried not to find out about Watergate and the subsequent cover-up.

"He knew enough not to want to know what was going on and that is a level of unaccountability and irresponsibility that I think should cause a resignation," Mr. Nader said when interviewed on the Columbia Broadcasting System television program, "Face the Nation."
