**Grand Jury
Again Calls
Ehrlichman**

Former White House aide John D. Ehrlichman underwent his second day of grand jury questioning by members of the Watergate special prosecution force yesterday.

Questioned Tuesday before a federal grand jury investigating the White House-sponsored break-in at the offices of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist, Ehrlichman was called yesterday by the older grand jury investigating the Watergate break-in and coverup.

The Watergate grand jury, which last heard from Ehrlichman in May, wanted to question him in light of revelations since then. Prosecutors have said the Watergate grand jurors are also exploring the 1971 Ellsberg break-in as a possible reason for the coverup of high-level involvement in the 1972 Watergate bugging.

Ehrlichman is scheduled to go before the Watergate grand jury again today and then back to the federal grand jury.

Federal indictments stemming from the Ellsberg break-in are expected next week.

Former White House special counsel Charles W. Colson has also testified before the grand jury investigating the Ellsberg break-in. Colson's attorney and partner, David I. Shapiro, confirmed yesterday.

He said Colson testified before the newer grand jury for four to five days over the past two weeks, but declined to say what subjects he was questioned about.
