

**SUPPORTER OF NIXON  
UNDAUNTED BY HOAX**

URBANA, Ill., Sept. 15 (AP)

—An Urbana businessman, Dwight Dobbs, says while the call he purportedly received from the "White House" was probably a hoax, it has not changed his feelings about the President.

"I still believe in Dick Nixon," Mr. Dobbs said Saturday.

Mr. Dobbs had erected a large billboard in Urbana that described his faith and support in the President. He said Mr. Nixon had called him Thursday night to express thanks.

In Washington, however, the White House spokesman, Gerald L. Warren, said the President had not called and that it appeared to have been a hoax.

Mr. Warren did say, however, that the President's wife had mailed Mr. Dobbs a letter Sept. 12 expressing the family's pleasure with his support.

Mr. Warren said that he telephoned Mr. Dobbs today to tell him the letter expressed the feelings of Mr. Nixon himself.

The billboard, which cost Mr. Dobbs \$300, read: "I have more faith in this man than I have in any of his accusers, especially the press."

As for the phone call, "I kind of think it was just some kids having fun," Mr. Dobbs said.
