Watergate Influence Seen in Court Cases

BOSTON, Sept. 21 (UPI) — At a news conference upon Chesterfield H. Smith, president of the American Bar Association, said today it will be "extremely difficult, if not impossible" for anyone charged with crimes that were testified to at the Watergate hearings to get a fair trial.

At a news conference upon his arrival at Logan International Airport here, Smith said that he believes President Nixon, according to his own statement, "will honor any definitive judgment" of the Supreme Court regarding tape to get a fair trial. to get a fair trial.

Smith, a trial lawyer from Lakeland, Fla., said he believes "it's going to be extremely difficult, if not impossible," to impanel a fair and impartial jury if such people as John N. Mitchell, John W. Dean, III, John D. Ehrlichman and others "are ever tried for as well as other officers, canand others "are ever tried for crimes that were testified to" hearings.
