Children at the Hearings

Hunt's Proud Family

Washington

Two of Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt's four children heard him testify at the Senate Watergate hearings yesterday and said they were proud of his performance on the witness stand.

"I think he's doing a great job," said Lisa Hunt, 22. "I'm very proud of him." "Me, too," added St. John

"Me, too," added St. John Hunt, 19, her brother. "an excellent job."

St. John and Lisa, a sophomore at the local American University and a psychology major, sat two rows behind their father as he testified.

A thin-faced youth with brown hair worn below his shoulders, St. John described himself as "a musician — a guitarist."

They said nothing as they listened to their father declare that "I have been

physically attacked and robbed in jail. I have been transferred from place to place, manacled and chained, hand and foot. I am

isolated from my motherless children."

Mrs. Hunt was killed in a plane crash in Chicago in December, 1972.

Although told by Hunt's lawyer that they didn't have to answer reporters' questions, both children appeared eager to express confidence in their father.

Lisa, who was wearing a short blue dress with matching turquoise nail polish, said that the Hunt children seldom see their father these days but visit him in jail "whenever we can—it depends on where he is."

St. John said that he, Lisa and another brother, 10-year-old David, live alone in the family house in Potomac, Md., a suburb of Washington.

Another sister, Kevin, 20. is a sophomore at Smith College in Northampton, Mass.
