**Threat to Agnew
Brings Jail Term**

ATLANTA, Sept. 24 (UPI)

—A man who threatened the life of Vice President Spiro T. Agnew last May has been sentenced to two years in prison by a federal judge.

Secret Service agents said W. M. Phinazee telephoned the threat to them and then waited to be arrested at an airport motel. Agents quoted Phinazee as saying he wanted to kill the Vice President because he had not supported the Indians in the uprising at Wounded Knee, S.D.

Phinazee was given a court-ordered psychiatric examination, and judged competent to stand trial.
