Judge Orders Affidavite On Bid to Change Pleas

U.S. District Chief Judge John J. Sirica has ordered five Watergate defendants to file detailed affidavits to support their request to change their guilty pleas to innocent.

The affidavits, in which the men are ordered to spell out the reasons they should be allowed to withdraw their initial pleas, are due later this week.

Co-conspirator E. Howard Hunt asked permission last week to change his plea be-cause he thought the breakin into Democratic National Headquarters was lawful and performed with White

even if it wasn't legal, he thought it was.

Hunt asked as well that

charges be dropped against him.

Four Miamians—Frank Four Miamians—Frank Sturgis, Bernard L. Barker, Eugenio R. Martinez and Virgilio Gonzalez — had asked that they be allowed to change their guilty pleas of innocent because they contend they were coerced into pleading guilty.

In an initial response to the requests by the five defendants, Special Watergate Prosecutor Archibald Cox had suggested that the men and performed with White file affidavits such as the House approval, and that ones ordered by Sirica.
