

**Limited Immunity Voted
In the Segretti Inquiry**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (UPI) — The Senate Watergate committee has voted to confer limited immunity from prosecution upon a 25-year-old Florida man who is expected to testify about the "dirty tricks" campaign of Donald H. Segretti, court papers disclosed yesterday.

The immunity was voted for Robert N. Benz, who was named as a co-conspirator with Mr. Segretti in an indictment that charges Mr. Segretti with illegally publishing unauthorized political statements.

Segretti has said he will plead guilty to those charges. Mr. Benz and another Florida man, George A. Hearing, were included in the indictment but were not named as defendants.

The committee also voted to confer immunity on Martin Douglas Kelley. There was no immediate information available on his identity or whether he was connected with Mr.

Segretti's activities. The court papers revealed that the special Watergate Prosecutor Archibald Cox, has not asked for his right to delay conferring immunity upon either men
