Limited Immunity Voted

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (UPI) — The Senate Watergate committee has voted to confer-limited immunity from prosecu-tion upon a 25-year-old Florida man who is expected to testify about the "dirty tricks" cam-paign of Donald H. Segretti, court papers disclosed yester-

paign of Donald R. Schlett, court papers disclosed yester-day. The immunity was voted for Robert N. Benz, who was named as a co-conspirator with Mr. Segretti in an indictment that charges Mr. Segretti with illegally publishing unauthor-ized political statements. Segretti has said he will plead guilty to those charges. Mr. Benz and another Florida man, George A. Hearing, were in-cluded in the indictment but were not named as defendants. The committee also voted to confer immunity on Martin Douglas Kelley. There was no immediate information avail-able on his identity or whether he was connected with Mr.
