## WXPost OCT 5 1973 Democrats Seen Bugged In '72 Meet

NEW YORK, Oct. 4 (UPI) State officials in Florida have evidence that the Democratic Party's headquarters at its national convention in Miami Beach last year was bugged by Republican saboteurs less than one month after the Watergate burglary was discovered, NBC News reported tonight.

The network quoted Richard Gerstein, Dade County state attorney, as saying the infor-mation about "secret listening devices" came from convicted Watergate conspirator James

mation about "secret listening devices" came from convicted Watergate conspirator James McCord. McCord has denied this, NBC said. "The Florida investigators believe this operation was part of the espionage plan submit-ted by G. Gordon Liddy, later convicted as Watergate con-spirator," NBC said. In an interview broadcast on the "NBC Nightly News." Gerstein said: "Based on in-formation we received during an interrogation of James Mc-Cord fast summer, we learned that the Fountainebleau Hotel (the Democratic National Committee's headquarters in Miami Beach) had been bug-ged during the Democratic Na-tional Convention and possi-bly at other times. This bug-ging was the result of a meet-ing that took place at Key Bis-cayney on March 30, 1972 a ging was the result of a meet-ing that took place at Key Bis-cayne on March 30, 1972, a meeting attended by former Attorney General John Mitch-ell and others, at which time the entire Watergate conspir-acy was planned.

acy was planned. "But Mr. Cox' office has asked us to withhold prosecu-tion and, for the time being, we are going along with their request," Gerstein said on NRC . 1
