**2 TO BE QUESTIONED
ON '72 'DIRTY TRICKS'**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 (UPI) — Two alleged political spies codenamed "Sedan Chair II" and "Fat Jack" will be questioned when the Senate Watergate committee resumes hearings Tuesday on 1972 campaign "dirty tricks," a spokesman said today.

According to previous testimony before the committee, the code names were used in Republican efforts to spy on the campaigns of Democratic contenders for the Presidential nomination last year.

"Sedan Chair II" has been identified as Michael W. McMinoway, allegedly an undercover man in the campaign of Senator Hubert H. Humphrey, Democrat of Minnesota.

"Fat Jack" was the code name for John Buckley, identified as a contact man between E. Howard Hunt Jr., a convicted Watergate conspirator and an informer in the campaign of Senator Edmund S. Muskie, Democrat of Maine.

Sam Dash, chief counsel for the Senate committee, said Mr. McMinoway and Mr. Buckley would be the next two witnesses, but he had no report on the committee's plans beyond that.

Mr. Dash had "no comment" on reports that the committee was investigating reports of cash contributions from Howard Hughes, the billionaire, to President Nixon's re-election campaign.
