## Attorney Calls Agnew 'A Crook'

U.S. Attorney James R. Thompson said yesterday he has never seen a stronger case of bribery or extortion than the one the government had developed against Vice President Spiro T. Agnew.

"The man is a crook, no question about that at all," Thompson said.

Thompson, federal district attorney for the northern district of Illinois, had been chosen by the justice department to defend the go ernment against Agnew's charges of prejudicial press leaks. He made the comments at a news conference on his return to Chicago yesterday.

"If that case had gone to trial and if those witnesses had testified as they said they would, a onviction would hav resulted. I have never seen a stronger case of bribery or extortion," Thompson said.

Thompson said he thinks that "on the whole a good resolution" has been made at the case.

"I have no doubt that if the vice president had stood trial and been convicted, he would have been sentenced to a very large number of years," Thompson said.
