

Parker Gave Nixon Pens, Not Cash

Daniel S. Parker, nominated by President Nixon to head the Agency for International Development, said yesterday he contributed no cash to President Nixon's 1972 re-election campaign.

Parker, board chairman of Parker Pen Co., said he gave the Committee for the re-election of the President 600 pen sets which he purchased from Parker Pen Co. at retailer's cost and which he said were sent out by the President as appreciation gifts.

Parker, who was vice chairman of the campaign finance committee, said he was credited by the re-election committee with a \$15,075 donation representing the estimated retail price of the pen sets.

Parker testified at a nomination hearing before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.
