

# Meany Has His Doubts

## Miami Beach

AFL-CIO president George Meany said yesterday he doubts whether President Nixon will choose a well qualified Vice President.

He said Mr. Nixon's "track record on appointments, very frankly, is not good."

"He is the fellow who appointed Mitchell . . . John Dean . . . Jeb Magruder, Gordon Liddy, Haldeman, Ehrlichman, the rest," Meany said. "So the pros-

pects for something better are not very good."

Meany refused to comment on the resignation Wednesday of Spiro T. Agnew as vice president, saying it "speaks for itself."

Meany said it won't make much difference who is confirmed by Congress for the vice presidency.

"Because whoever the fellow is, he'll be the image of the top man, and the trouble is the top man," Meany said.
