

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (UPI)—The Senate voted today to keep former Vice President Agnew's staff on the payroll for 30 days to help him wind up his affairs.

Mr. Agnew had 15 staff members in the Senate, ranging in pay from \$4,000 to \$17,000 a year.

The resolution, continuing those who helped Mr. Agnew to preside over the Senate, was approved by voice vote without objection after it was submitted by Senator Howard Cannon, Democrat of Nevada, on behalf of himself, the Democratic leader, Mike Mansfield, and the Republican leader, Hugh Scott.

Mr. Mansfield said the move simply extended "the normal courtesies that would be given any other member of the Senate in similar circumstances. If it wasn't done, they'd be chopped off the payroll at the close of business today."

The resolution provided that the staff members would be supervised by the Secretary of the Senate, Francis R. Valeo, and that Mr. Valeo "shall remove them if he finds they are not attending to their duties."
