The three major television networks a sked Congress yesterday for permission to televise hearings on conformation of a new vice president.

The National Broadcasting Co. and the American Broadcasting Co. said their

requests were made through their Washington bureaus. Arthur R. Tyalor, presi-dent of the Columbia Broad-casting System, sent a tele-gram to Senate and House leaders leaders.

"Only through the eyes of television cameras can the public across the Nation witness the performance of their elected representatives in meeting their grave constitutional duties.

"To this end we respectfully urge your good offices in opening to television overage these proceedings both in committee and furing the ensuing action on the floor." ensuing action on the floor,' it said.
