

Nader wants ITT merger case probe

HARTFORD (Conn.) — Ralph Nader asked a federal court yesterday to reopen the International telephone & Telegraph-Hartford Fire Insurance Co. merger to subpoena former Administration officials to find out whether "corruption" was involved in an antitrust settlement.

Among the former officials Nader said he wants subpoenaed are Spiro Agnew, John Mitchell, H. R. Halderman, John Ehrlichman, Charles Colson and John Connally.

The petition filed in U.S. District Court also asked the court to subpoena ITT chairman Harold Geneen and his Washington lobbyist, Dita Beard.
