

Krogh Gets One Charge Dismissed

Los Angeles

A Superior Court judge refused yesterday to dismiss burglary and conspiracy charges against John D. Ehrlichman and three other former White House aides. But he agreed to dismiss one count of an indictment against Egil Krogh Jr.

Judge James G. Kolts dismissed a charge against Krogh of solicitation of a

burglary in the 1971 break-in at the office of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist.

Kolts said there is insufficient evidence to show that such a charge could be sustained by the prosecution at a trial. Krogh is charged in two other counts in the indictment. Those charges still stand.

Kolts rejected all other defense arguments for dismissal.
