Senator Adlai Stevenson III, (Dem-Ill.) said yesterday he is preparing legislation to re-establish the office of the special Watergate prosecutor.

He said such a move should be considered as a "last chance" before considering impeachment proceedings against President Nixon.

"Let's try once more," Stevenson said. "Such legislation will give the President a last chance to keep his promises to uphold the Constitution and to bring the Watergate matter to a conclusion. If this doesn't work, we will have tried everything and Congress will be left with little choice except to commence proceedings for removal from office."

Stevenson said he hopes to introduce his proposal in the Senate when the Congress reconvenes tomorrow.
