

"They really ripped me off good," said Edward Bennett Williams, the criminal lawyer and president of the Washington Redskins. "They got all my wife's jewels." He referred to the burglary of his home in Potomac, Md., which occurred Sunday while he watched the Redskins defeat the St. Louis Cardinals at Robert F. Kennedy Stadium in Washington.

Mr. Williams is currently representing Robert L. Vesco, the New Jersey financier who is under indictment with former Attorney General John N. Mitchell and former Commerce Secretary Maurice H. Stans on charges of illegal campaign contributions. He said a number of legal papers were taken by the burglars, but was unsure of their nature.
