**Telegrams to Capital  
Setting a Record Pace**

The latest Nixon Administration developments have prompted a record flood of telegrams to the White House and Capitol Hill, a Western Union spokesman said yesterday.

The spokesman said that 56,000 personal opinion messages from throughout the country were sent to Washington from Saturday night to mid-morning yesterday the Associated Press reported.

A high-speed computerized printer has been installed to relieve the backlog that at one point reached 15,000 messages, the spokesman

About 6,000 of the messages costing \$2 for 15 words were sent to the White House and the rest to Congressmen, said the spokesman at Western Union corporate headquarters at Mahwah, N.J.
