Reagan Praises

Governor Ronald Reagan and other California Republicans praised President Nixon yesterday for agreeing to turn the Watergate tapes over to a federal judge as ordered by the courts.

The President's announcement, Governor Reagan said, "justifies our continued patience and confidence that our system of govern-ment is still working."

The afternoon praise, however, followed morning action — before the announcement — in which:

• The Alameda county Board of Supervisors voted 3 to 1 for a motion calling for California's Congressional delegation to initiate impeachment proceedings against the President.

• The Marin county

Board of Supervisors set a "public forum" for 4:30 p.m. next Tuesday to discuss whether the President should resign or be impeached.

• The University of California at Berkeley scheduled a convocation tomorrow atternoon at the Greek Theater on recent events involving the President and the Justice Department. Classes will not be canceled for the event.

• The California Democratic Party sent a telegram to Congress urging President Nixon's impeachment unless he resigns — a telegram, it said, that was signed by 3000 persons.
