

Reagan Praises Nixon

Governor Ronald Reagan and other California Republicans praised President Nixon yesterday for agreeing to turn the Watergate tapes over to a federal judge as ordered by the courts.

The President's announcement, Governor Reagan said, "justifies our continued patience and confidence that our system of government is still working."

The afternoon praise, however, followed morning action — before the announcement — in which:

- The Alameda county Board of Supervisors voted 3 to 1 for a motion calling for California's Congressional delegation to initiate impeachment proceedings against the President.

- The Marin county

Board of Supervisors set a "public forum" for 4:30 p.m. next Tuesday to discuss whether the President should resign or be impeached.

- The University of California at Berkeley scheduled a convocation tomorrow afternoon at the Greek Theater on recent events involv-

ing the President and the Justice Department. Classes will not be canceled for the event.

- The California Democratic Party sent a telegram to Congress urging President Nixon's impeachment unless he resigns — a telegram, it said, that was signed by 3000 persons.
