

U.S. Reply: 'No'**Washington**

The United States yesterday rejected Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's call for American and Soviet troops to help police the Middle East cease-fire.

White House spokesman Gerald L. Warren declared, "The United States has no intention of sending troops to the Middle East."

"We hope that other outside powers will not send troops to the Middle East," he added, in a clear reminder to the Soviet Union to avoid direct involvement.

State Department officials said the U.S. view is that the United Nations truce supervisory organization should have the responsibility for monitoring the cease-fire.
