Meany Lays 'Instability' To Nixon

The AFL-CIO President George Meany said yesterday that President Nixon appears to suffer from "dangerous emitional instability."

The White House quickly called Meany's charge "incredible, inexcusable and irresponsible" and declared that Mr. Nixon's health is excellent.

The sharp White House response came within minutes after Meany called again for Mr. Nixon's resignation or impeachment and raised questions about Mr. Nixon's current emotional state.

Deputy press secretary Gerald L. Warren called Meany's assertion "one of the most incredible, inexcusable, irresponsible ever made by an individual who is in a position to have his remarks and comments carried in the national news media."

Asked to describe Mr. Nixon's current health, Warren responded: "Excellent."
