

**COAST TRIAL SEEKS
PRESIDENTIAL TAPES**

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 24 (AP) —Prosecution and defense attorneys says that it should be possible now to obtain any Presidential tapes relevant to the break-in at the office of Dr. Daniel Ellsberg's former psychiatrist.

Indicted in the break-in are the former Presidential aide John D. Ehrlichman and Egil Krogh Jr., David R. Young Jr.

and G. Gordon Liddy, whose attorneys are scheduled to appear in Superior Court Nov. 12 to argue that the case should be thrown out.

After President Nixon agreed to release the Watergate tapes to the court in Washington, District Attorney Joseph Busch of Los Angeles County said, "I think that constitutes a waiver of executive privilege and sets a precedent that would apply to tapes that might be relevant to the Los Angeles case — if such tapes exist."
