Representative John J. Rhodes, Republican of Arizona, was given a clear road today to become the House Republican leader if Gerald R. Ford becomes Vice President when his only remaining opponent, Representative Leslie C. Arends, Republican of Illinois, withdrew.

Mr. Ford will not resign his leadership post until he is confirmed by Congress. The election be the unanimous choice of the House members.
